Jen's primary responsibilities include documenting the decline of wildlife in the Stillaguamish Watershed and representing the Tribe at local meetings. Focus on both game and nongame species. Current and past projects include:

- Elk monitoring
- Forest Practice Activity Application review/site visits
- Salmon recovery assistance
- Beaver habitat protection
- Herbicide sampling
- Tribal hunting issues
- Wetland habitat review
- Waterfowl/Shorebird habitat review

Jen is a member of the Snohomish County Resource Advisory Committee (RAC), Landscape and Wildlife Advisory Group (LWAG), Intertribal Wildlife Technical Committee, and alternate member of the Snohomish County Marine Resource Advisory Committee (MRC).
