STILLAGUAMISH TRIBAL TAX COMMISSION REGULATION GOVERNING DISQUALIFYING CRIMES FOR BUSINESS LICENSES

Tribal Regulation No.: 17-TAXCOMM-01

Effective Date: From October 19, 2017 until amended or repealed

Application: Applicants for Business Licenses and/or Their Employees Authorized to Conduct

Work on Stillaguamish Tribal lands.

1. Authority

Business License and Taxation Code 3.06.223(16)

2. Purpose

(a) To ensure that persons convicted of disqualifying crimes are not licensed to conduct business on Stillaguamish Tribal Lands.

3. Applicability

The crimes listed below are used to determine eligibility for business licenses under 3,06.104, et seq.

4. Jurisdictional Inclusiveness of Convictions

Disqualifying convictions shall include the crimes, or their close equivalents, in any tribal, state or federal court. The date of conviction is counted from the day a judgment is entered in the court of that jurisdiction.

7. Convictions for Attempt or Conspiracy

For purposes of this regulation, convictions for Attempt to commit a crime or conspiracy to commit a crime will be considered to be the same as a conviction for the crime itself.

8. Sexual Motivation

Any conviction or pending charge for a crime with the enhancement of sexual motivation shall be permanently disqualifying.
